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Take-away tasks	<p>All about me: Talk about why your name was chosen Share pictures of your naming ceremony Who has the longest first name in your family Make a name card for your bedroom door. Find out which letters are capitals and which are lower case. Make name labels for members of your family. Make another set to hide around your home to match together when you find them. Talk about similarities and differences in your family...who else has your hair / eye colour? Talk about pictures of people on posters or in newspapers. What do they look like? How are they feeling? How do we know? Collect a selection of objects made from different materials. Talk about how each one looks. Hide them in a bag then feel inside and talk about how each one feels. My family: Look at photos of you and your family from now and from the past. Talk about your grandparents...who are their children? Were clothes different a long time ago? What do you do to help at home? Compare shoe sizes with your family. Who has the biggest shoes? Try different actions using your feet such as tiptoeing, skipping, striding, jumping and hopping. Sing head, shoulders, knees and toes together Birthdays: Find out when you were born Talk about the month and time of year Find the month of your birthday on a calendar Talk about how long it will be until their birthday Talk about birthday of other family members Talk about how you celebrate birthdays in your family Play guess the baby with photos of members of your family when they were babies</p>	<p>Find things made from wheat, oats, barley, rye or corn Find out what is in your breakfast Look at different kinds of bread in a bakery Take a picture of a field of grain and a combine harvester if you're lucky! Talk about what happens to the corn and that lots of foods are made with flour Help make toast. Talk about what happens Talk about eating out for a celebration. What happened? Visit London Transport Museum.</p>	<p>Sing Old MacDonald together Learn the names of baby animals Read books about farm animals in the library Draw a picture of your favourite farm animal and label the parts such as horn, tail, hooves, snout etc. Make up a farmyard story Gardening: Plant some seeds in a small pot. Label the pot. Talk about how to keep plants healthy. Fruit: Sort and count fruit in different ways Talk about which fruits we take the skin off to eat Find fruit in other foods such as crumble or jam Try a fruit you haven't eaten before Vegetables: Look at the vegetables in the supermarket. What are they called? Choose something to cook at try that you haven't before. Help pack the shopping. How many vegetables did you buy? Talk about how vegetables grow. If you grow them in the garden or at an allotment look at the parts that grow underground. Find out how potatoes are cooked in different ways.</p>
