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What a busy week we have had exploring reptiles with a focus on crocodiles. The children have enjoyed using non-fiction texts to research facts about crocodiles and tried really hard to complete a class table of A to Z vertebrates that lay eggs. The children were like the creative dragon learning buddy as they participated in crocodile crafts, drawing round templates, cutting them out and then using crushed pasta to create the bumpy scutes. Stamping on the pasta was great fun! Continuing our learning about reptiles, 'Richard' from the 'Reptile Roadshow' wrote a letter to us about his visit on Tuesday! The children were excited to respond to his letter, suggesting which reptiles they would like him to bring in and why. In Maths, we revisited number bonds to ten and twenty. The children also used number tracks to problem solve addition number sentences.
