The children discussed what happened with their talk partners and then sequenced the story, recalling the events. They also mixed paints to create a scene of the fire. During our discussions, we sorted pictures into 'then' and 'now', looking at things that have changed such as transport, fire fighters and the Royal Family. The children then thought carefully about 'why things are better now than in the past' referring back to the pictures to support their explanations.
