

Learning Logs

Often children demonstrate different learning capabilities at home and Learning Logs are a fantastic way to share the learning that takes place away from school.
Staff plan for themes across blocks of weeks at school and will regularly include a prompting title or question on a double page spread in the learning log. Enjoy recording any learning linked to the theme on the double page spread in a variety of ways. For example, adults could write and draw what the child says or does; you could work together to stick in photographs or magazine clippings, or attach something your child has made, drawn, painted or written.
Each task will include the date it was issued and the date it need to be back at school. Children will then have an opportunity to share their Learning Logs with their classmates.
Below is the school's letter and number formation to encourage your child to develop good writing habits for the future. Please help by encouraging correct letter and number formation at home.
Enjoy sharing time together to complete the tasks in the Learning Logs and celebrate your child's progress as they move through the year.

Remind children that capitals are always tall and never go under the line.
Letters such as Cc Ss Ww must be clearly different sizes for capitals and lower case letters.
